# POLMIN PROJECT LEGAL INFORMATION

Objectives: The research project, POLMIN, is supported and financed by Sciences Po and is led by Jan Rovny, Associate Professor at CEE and LIEPP, Sciences Po (the Fondation Nationale des Sciences Politiques and Institut d'études politiques de Paris). The aim of the study is to assess the preferences and political behavior of individuals belonging to linguistic minority groups, in comparison with the national majority in Slovakia, Estonia, and Hungary. The project carries out elite interviews with academics, political representatives, NGO representatives and public officials working in the area of (linguistic) minority interests. It also carries out online surveys of representative samples of the population in Slovakia, Estonia and Hungary, focusing on political preferences, and political behavior under diverse political and social contexts. Participation is completely voluntary.

#### Category of data processed:

- Interview: professional data (education, employment), political opinions and behavior, ethnic origin
- Online tool: gender, year of birth, postal code, marital status, professional data (education, employment), income, political opinions and behavior, religious affiliation, ethnic origin

#### Data protection measures:

- Participation in this survey is voluntary.
- Collection and access to personal data is limited to the exclusive use of the researcher, within the framework of the purposes specified above;
- None of the personal data collected by the researcher can be published or made public so that participants can be identified;
- The survey dataset is anonymized by default and by concept
- The personal data of the participants of the interview will be pseudonymized after the collection. The data will be encrypted.
- The access rights to the data will be limited and only accessible to the research team and secured by a personal identifier and a password.

Risk for participants: No risk for participants is identified

<u>Data archive and duration</u>: The data will be treated until 2022 in our current archives until publication, then in Sciences Po research repository, in a proper and sufficient manner for obtaining minimized, secured and definitely anonymized dataset. The dataset may be eventually stored on a research repository (Open Science).
